  - We have completed an initial document for transitioning to digital payments and should have something formal to share today.

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## PR – OPEN – PLEASE ANNOUNCE

The PR subcommittee continues to focus on increasing community outreach and strengthening visibility across Yavapai County. Efforts are underway to distribute updated pull tab flyers in high-impact locations such as libraries, treatment centers, probation offices, and local businesses. Outreach to law enforcement agencies has begun, with follow-ups planned to establish stronger communication and placement opportunities.

The committee also identified gaps in PR rack tracking and coverage, and is working to rebuild an accurate inventory while restocking existing locations and expanding into new ones, including hospitals. Coordination with H&I and Regional PR is in progress to ensure alignment on initiatives such as Drug Court and the Summer Institute, including potential scholarship opportunities.

Administrative needs such as meeting directories have been identified, and core operational items (including rent) are up to date. Overall, the committee is focused on improving structure, increasing outreach consistency, and building stronger connections within the community to better carry the message.

## **Newcomer Event Discussion:**

**Summary:** *Discussion focused on interest in creating a newcomer-centered event that could help make NA more welcoming and engaging for people coming in from treatment and for other newcomers. Ideas included a free BBQ or park event with food, volleyball, a unity-themed concept, possible coordination with treatment centers, fundraising support from interested home groups, and whether to connect it to an existing event or keep it separate. Members were encouraged to take the idea back to their home groups, connect with Mo if interested, and continue exploring ways to support newcomer involvement.*

**John:** I am interested in Mo's idea about a newcomer event.

We have a lot of vans that show up to our home group, and I know it is the same for other meetings. We decided to start putting money aside for this event. **Mo:** I am mostly just seeing if anyone is interested.

**John:** It might help if we had someone going between treatment centers.

**Mo:** I am just seeing if there are other home groups interested in being a part of it. If not, we will probably figure out how to do it on our own. We would also want to make sure we do not hold it close to an Area event.

**John:** If our activities guy was here, this would definitely catch his attention.

**Mo:** What I liked about the chili cook-off was that there were people there I did not know. I love how the events are pulling in treatment clients and newcomers.

**John:** We could get flyers and things like that out there. I love your idea.

**Bailey:** There is going to be another BBQ in the park in June. Maybe that could be the theme.

**Annette:** If home groups are interested and want to raise money, how would they do that?

**Mo:** You can have my number if you are interested. I am going to be talking about it for a while, so please take it back to your home groups.

**John:** Would you want it to happen during an event that is already going on?

**Mo:** I am all for collaborating. I may call John about it as well. It really is for them. How are we making NA attractive to our newcomers? We get people into the meetings and tell them to stay and keep coming back.

**Trent:** Why can't we do this at Lua Huo? That would be a great event to bring newcomers to.

**John:** Maybe we could have a liaison for two months.

**Mo:** I like the idea of two months.

**Trent:** It is not on the flyer and cannot be added, but it would still take extra effort to get treatment centers to bring their clients.

**Mo:** It was going to be a free event, so we were not planning to bring it to Area as an official Area event.

**Trent:** If someone is new, they would not be expected to pay.

**Joe:** What about doing something around the Fourth of July?

**Mo:** I will be in Show Low for the Fourth of July.

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**Bailey:** There have been home groups that put on events with extra money. I do not think it is necessary to attach it to another event. It could just be a BBQ in the park. Reach out to Mo and have the D.O.E. get ahold of Mo if they want to donate.

**Josie:** Girls Gone Clean used to do a picnic every year, but we do not have the funds right now. We do have people willing to be of service. Treatment centers come, and we do not get a lot of donations, but there are a few of us who would like to help.

**John:** It would be nice to have some sort of theme for the newcomer event and have it be about unity.

**Bailey:** Maybe something like a white key tag BBQ.

**Annette:** Our Area used to do Capture the Flag. In order to steal a flag, you had to take three home group members to one meeting and take it. Some people would go around and take everyone's flag. You would have to coordinate the drive to go get it. It got people out of their comfort zone and added some competition. Each home group would get their own flag.

## **Discussion on Adding Concept Education During Wait Time:**

**Annette:** We often end up with a period of time where we are waiting on totals. In another Area I was a part of, we would read from the Little Red Book and then people could ask questions. It helped build a working knowledge of the Concepts. I am not saying we need to do that today, but it may be something to add or a change to our format that could include more education. Does anyone have the Little Red Book?

**Mo:** Let's start at the beginning.
